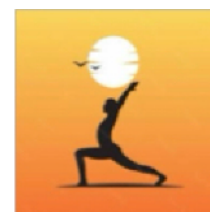

## Parish Council News

The Parish Council met on 20<sup>th</sup> April following on from the Annual Parish Meeting.

### Annual Parish Meeting

Eight villagers attended the Annual Parish Meeting. After presenting the minutes from last year's meeting, the Parish Council Chair, Mrs Emily Greening, ran through the key issues and achievements of the Parish Council over the previous year. Items covered included the playfield land swap; the completion of the permissive footpath project from the Parish Hall car park; the new website; ongoing efforts to improve traffic calming; rejuvenation of the Speed Watch team; reinvigoration of the Neighbourhood Plan; the work of the Village Volunteers; and confirmation of the FY2026/27 Parish Council precept of £21,000.

Mr Mike Phillips followed on with an explanation of Wiltshire Council's processes and key issues that he has been pursuing on behalf of the Ethandun Ward.

#### Neighbourhood Plan

#### Playfield

We still await the decision from Wiltshire Council on the playfield land swap planning application for The Three Daggars. Separately, the playfield equipment was recently inspected and some playfield equipment repairs will be done to fix some routine wear-and-tear issues.

#### Highway Matters / Footpaths / LHFIG

We recently received a response from Wiltshire Council about our concerns regarding the Crossroads Farm junction. They do not support our request for STOP signs on the roads joining the main Edington-West Ashton road. Instead, they suggest that we ask the landowners of the fields around the junction to remove the hedges and install open fences for better visibility. We will ask the question of the land owners, but we do not think this is a particularly viable or cost-effective solution compared to our STOP-sign suggestion. We will continue to pursue the matter. Wiltshire Council at least concede that there is a persistent safety concern at the junction, largely due to driver behaviour.

#### Speed Watch

Speed Watch is back up and running. Our thanks to Mark Burgess and his team for volunteering to undertake this task to help keep our roads safe.

## TVM AGM Report

The AGM began with my Chairman's report and then Keith Girt, our Treasurer, took us through the finances and figures for 2025. Despite some inevitable bumps and potholes in the road, we have succeeded in keeping TVM in relatively robust good health during 2025, and it is continuing to provide its valued and much needed service for our local community.



During the year Eric Mitchell decided to step down from his role as TVM Operations Manager for personal reasons. Eric did a great job in helping TVM resolve many of its maintenance issues, many of which had been long standing and costly, and we thank him for all his dedication and all his hard work in helping to keep TVM on the road and serving us all. Eric will be a tough act to follow, but we have been fortunate that Steve Forward has agreed to step up and take over the Operations Manager role and he is already managing the maintenance and repair needs of TVM with an expert ease and aplomb.

Some 14 local clubs and societies used TVM during 2025 and the schools of Minster, Bishops Cannings, Keevil, Bratton, St Barnabus and Lavington all made use of the bus for trips and events. TVM continues to provide its regular shopping trips for local villagers to Westbury, Devizes and Warminster and there is also a number of monthly local interest and lunch club trips.

The Wiltshire Council funding contribution to support TVM and other community transport groups has come under rumour of drastic cuts and reductions this year. Happily this threat has receded for 2026, but it is a signal to the near future that TVM will need to explore and capture alternative income

## Edington Station Yard Ltd

### History of the Yard

Following closure of the station in the early 1960s, the site had been used first as the base for a successful local builder and then by a Company manufacturing fibreglass moulds for the construction industry. Both businesses had provided employment opportunities for local residents.

At the beginning of the 1990s, with construction techniques changing and the business on site in decline, the imminent arrival of a Chemical Recycling business, which had recently experienced both a major fire and a separate explosion at its factory in Warminster, raised alarms amongst local residents, not only about safety, but also for potential contamination of the local environment.

After much lobbying, the local Highway Authority persuaded the prospective purchaser that the then entrance to Edington Station Yard was totally unsuitable for the size and number of vehicle movements they were anticipating and the purchase was not progressed.

In 1993, 35 local individuals decided that they would acquire the site not simply to protect the local area from any future undesirable occupier, but also to provide the opportunity for businesses to operate from, in this part of rural Wiltshire. A new entrance road was constructed into the site, and a phased redevelopment of the buildings undertaken to provide units for businesses to operate from and to once again provide potential employment opportunities for local residents.

### Today at the Yard

The Estate now comprises a variety of units of different sizes, including workshops and offices, all leased at competitive rents. The company is run by a board of directors who live in the local area, and it employs Stephen Brickell of Brockhurst Property Management in

Corsham (01225 690041) to deal with initial enquiries from businesses about leasing units and the day-to-day management of the estate.

Aside from trading profitably and paying dividends to its shareholders, one of the stated goals of the company is to support our local community by donating a percentage of its profits to local charities and good causes, such as village groups and functions, local community lunches, supporting music education in two schools who take children from this area, the village mini-bus, and local publications.

The company is always looking to broaden its reach to include new charities and community initiatives within the Edington, Bratton, Erlestoke, Coulston, Steeple Ashton and Westbury area.

### The Future at the Yard

Over the past 33 years, many of the original shareholders who backed the development of the Station Yard have passed away or relocated. Edington Station Yard Limited currently holds a number of its own shares. These are available to people living in the area who would be interested in becoming involved in the future of the Company.

### Open Meeting - 29<sup>th</sup> May

There will be an Open Meeting in the Edington Parish Hall at 6.00pm on Friday 29<sup>th</sup> May 2026 (following the company's AGM which is restricted to shareholders).

## WI Report



Ever wondered why you can't recycle your black plastics? Officers from Wiltshire Council's Waste and Recycling team were on hand to answer these and other questions, plus give some tips and do a bit of myth busting at April's W.I. meeting. Most of us know that we will be moving to 3 weekly collections, leaving many wondering how they will manage; concerned about overflowing bins, smells as the temperatures rise and vermin.

Analysis of our grey bin contents carried out in 2022 showed that food waste made up a shocking 51%. A move to kerbside food waste removal looks set to reduce that, and we're not talking about another huge bin to lug up and down our steps and driveways; a small canister for indoors fits into a slightly larger one to put out on "bin day". A small bag for soft plastics will also be coming.

How often do we hear: "We go to all that trouble to sort our waste and then it gets shipped abroad" In fact 91% of our recyclables are processed in the UK; about 9% in Europe and less than 1% to India; these are commercial contracts.

Other changes that have reduced rubbish going into landfill include: a giant "shredder" for use on large items such as sofas, the material then going for incineration; the emergence of charities that will refurbish and sell such items; and "swapping" facilities at the recycling centres - you can even go and get half-used tins of paint for free.

Time allowed for only a brief mention on manufacturers responsibilities to reduce/change packaging, and of course the environmental effects of transporting/ incinerating waste makes for a whole new talk. That black plastic? The technology behind the waste sorter cannot yet distinguish between a black sack and its conveyor belt! Final tip: screw up those little bits of foil/cardboard into small balls or they will fall through the belt.

The skittles season is in full swing, out of three matches played we have won two and drawn one; fuelled by beer and chips!

In May we will hold our Annual Meeting, with the election of a new committee. We will also consider Resolutions put forward at National W.I. level to be the basis for our Campaigns.

### Walk & Talk

The monthly walks are increasing in popularity with growing numbers of non-members joining us; see elsewhere in the newsletter and on the village noticeboards for more details. The February walk took in Bratton, and the March walk went via Sandy Lane and down to Bratton via Luccombe Down where Danish prisoners were supposedly beheaded after the Battle of Ethendun in AD878.

Hopefully the April walk will be less cold!

Maureen Hinton came along to the April meeting, armed with plants, cuttings and lots of tips, too many to include in this article. Enthusiasm and knowledge shone through her talk. Did you know you can use nappies, new of course! to line hanging baskets to keep in the moisture. Pick your moss for baskets now whilst green and put in a bag and wet, until you are ready to use it. Use yacht varnish to paint inside clay pots to protect them. Put cut tulips in a vase, in front of a mirror and they will stay upright! Potpourri lemon balm keeps the flies away. Try growing dates, put into a jar, pour on hot water then plant in ericaceous soil. Any citrus can be grown this way, soak for 4 days before planting. Maureen then did a table decoration - flower arrangement of greenery and flowers. A very interesting talk on pot, plants, and cuttings.

Next month, May 7<sup>th</sup>, will be the AGM starting at 7.15pm - doors open at 7.00pm for refreshments. 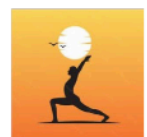
