If you are connected with a club or organisation, please do review your website entry and let me know if there are any changes you wish to make.

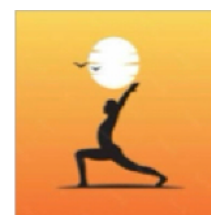
Spotlight on Yoga with Marilyn

Village Fête - can you help?

Neighbourhood Plan

Playfield

We still await the decision from Wiltshire Council on the playfield land swap planning application for The Three Dagers. Separately, the playfield equipment was recently inspected and some playfield equipment repairs will be done to fix some routine wear-and-tear issues.

Highway Matters / Footpaths / LHFIG

We recently received a response from Wiltshire Council about our concerns regarding the Crossroads Farm junction. They do not support our request for STOP signs on the roads joining the main Edington-West Ashton road. Instead, they suggest that we ask the landowners of the fields around the junction to remove the hedges and install open fences for better visibility. We will ask the question of the land owners, but we do not think this is a particularly viable or cost-effective solution compared to our STOP-sign suggestion. We will continue to pursue the matter. Wiltshire Council at least concede that there is a persistent safety concern at the junction, largely due to driver behaviour in not giving way.

Battle of Ethandun Commemoration

A committee is forming to take forward the idea of organising a celebration for the 1150th anniversary of the Battle of Ethandun in 2028. This defining battle shaped the course of English history, and our village, and so we hope to celebrate it in style with a programme of events, perhaps including a re-enactment, talks, music,

performances, craft displays and more. But these things don't organise themselves, and so we are seeking volunteers to join the organising committee; please do consider joining in to help spread the load of planning and running the event.

Areas that will need committee volunteers to provide their help will include: Publicity & Social Media; Finance & Grants; Infrastructure & Facilities (loos, car parking, stalls etc), Event Programme; Participant Liaison (re-enactment groups, blue-light services etc); and a committee Chair to coordinate it all.

WI Report

Before the official business, we heard details about Walk and Talk - the increasingly popular monthly walk researched and led by Cathy Dowlen. We were reminded about the successful MacMillan coffee morning, skittles and National Theatre plays streamed at Anne Ilsley's home.

Some have also gone on ballet or theatre trips, arranged by Anne Totttingham.

Jan Billinge then led a discussion on the two resolutions to be voted on at the National level:

- Accessibility of public toilet facilities to promote dignity, health and social inclusion.
- Action on Women's Homelessness.

After a short quiz and exchange of views, we voted for both if we approved of them. Anne Totttingham will be our delegate at the national assembly, and has our approval to vote for one on the day, taking our views into account. Democracy in action!

We then moved on to the AGM.

Secretary Helen O'Donoghue reviewed the year on behalf of the committee. Last year's meetings covered a range of subjects, some rural - local farming, grand gardens. Two of our members have particular talents: Anne Johns, as a writer, introduced us to Thomas Hardy's sisters training as teachers in Salisbury, where Anne had trained: Diane Vose, described her life as a press photographer, illustrated with superb photographs. In complete contrast, we learned from the Wiltshire Waste team about what happens to our rubbish, and ate delicious chocolate made by an artisan chocolate maker. We also had two parties.

President Anne Tottingham thanked the committee for their support during a year which she found challenging and rewarding. She is always prepared to try out new things and follow members' suggestions. The WI is the largest women's group in the country, and our own branch is growing, with four new members this year. Anne encouraged all members to help out with various jobs to support the committee.

The new committee was then elected and, following a secret ballot, Anne was re-elected as President.

At next month's meeting, the speaker will be from the RNLI.

AVR Wiltshire Half Marathon

On behalf of Avon Valley Runners, we wanted to provide you with advanced notice for this year's AVR Wiltshire Half Marathon, taking place on **Sunday 29th November 2026**.

This will be the 14th year of the event, which raises vital funds for the Wiltshire and Bath Air Ambulance, and we're really looking forward to providing another fantastic day for runners in the local area.

The race will start at **11:00am** from Station Yard in Edington, with runners passing through Steeple Ashton and Keevil before finishing back at Station Yard. Participants are expected to begin arriving from around **9:30am**, with the final runners finishing at about **2:00pm**. All course signage will be cleared by **4:00pm**.

As in previous years, there may be some minor disruption while participants are parking and the race is in progress. We are committed to keeping this to an absolute minimum and will have marshals in place to help ensure everything runs smoothly and safely.

Memories of John Wragg RA by Richard Spicer FRCS

I knew John for over 50 years and he was one of my closest friends.

It is surprising how many Devizes residents do not know about John. I write this as a friend rather than an expert on art or art history. His many achievements, accolades and exhibitions here and abroad are well documented on the internet. He was principally a sculptor initially, but always a painter as well.

More people seem to know about David Inshaw than know of John. The two are Devizes's outstanding artists. Perhaps it is because John was shy. They were rivals but got on reasonably well until 1991 when John was elected Royal Academician; after that Inshaw became antagonistic, presumably because he resented the fact that he was never a RA.

John was a Yorkshireman, training at the York School of Art and later in London; he never lost his Yorkshire accent but he was very happy to have made Devizes his home. He taught at Chelsea School of Art (where one of my sons later studied) from 1961 to 1990 and was much liked by his students. I was a student in London in the 1960s and I often wonder if my life might have been different if I had moved in his circles in those days. As it is we did not meet until the early 1970s when both our marriages were disintegrating; the search for female affection was an immediate bond and involved some fun times, but we immediately found many other mutual interests which cemented our friendship until his death. He was very happy to drive to Chelsea in a succession of increasingly powerful cars as his work sold for increasingly large sums. I was also a petrolhead.

I had a nomadic career with spells in the North of England and two different years working abroad, but we always kept in touch. It was a great moment for us both when, around the time he was awarded his RA I moved from a consultant job in Leeds to one in Bristol so it was easier to travel to Devizes more often; Jane and I could stay at her parents' house and we could spend the evening together. His house and studio was staggering distance from the Bear so that was a usual haunt. After I retired we moved even closer to Devizes and I saw him most weeks. Sometimes we had lunch in a restaurant where the waitress was very friendly and allowed my dog to be with us.

I think John spoke more than I did. We never ran out of topics and we covered women, philosophy, dogs, cars, literature, wildlife, guns, and back to women. The one subject we tended to avoid was Art - if I had been to an exhibition and wished to discuss a particular artist or painting his response was always the same, 'Shut up, you know bugger all about art' - and that was it. In all other subjects he was interested in my views. He was however happy to tell me about artists he had known personally such as David Hockney and Alberto Giacometti. He did once permit me to discuss the diaries of Delacroix; I think he admired me for reading them as he had not.

John photographed every painting he did and gave me a photo. I have an extensive collection of these; some are framed and on walls along with the few original paintings we have, and one sculpture.

The eventual love of John's life was Deborah McCabe (Debs), a successful sculptor. They had happy years together and she tolerated our nonsense. Sadly she died too early of a rare cancer in 2005. He never got over losing Debs and after she died he never did another sculpture. He had no shortage of girlfriends but no one ever came near being the soulmate Debs had been. John and I used to walk together on the hills above Devizes. John saw me through the lives of four spaniels (for some reason he called them all Ben). There is a remote

spot up there where we scattered Debs' ashes. Fifteen years later his son Julian and I took his ashes to join hers, accompanied by the latest Ben (actually Digby).

John had some health problems in later life and as a typical Yorkshireman he had strong views on each illness and was very suspicious of his doctors, however I was flattered that he did value my opinion on medical matters. On two occasions he ordered me to accompany him to consultations with his GP. I acted as referee between the opinionated Yorkshireman and his bemused doctor. On one occasion he was admitted to hospital for an operation and it was agreed that he would come and stay with us for a few days after discharge as he lived on his own. The day of his discharge was a Sunday. John and I had been on jovial terms with the nurses but on that day there was a grumpy and obstructive nurse in charge who said he had to stay until a discharge summary had been written and a decision made regarding removal of his drain. By lunch time we had lost patience and when nurse Grumpy was otherwise occupied we absconded, scampering down the hospital corridors, John holding his drainage bag and I carrying his suitcase, both of us giggling like naughty schoolboys. I removed his drain the next day and he went home a few days later.

John had a stroke in the early days of Covid lockdown. He was admitted to hospital and recovered to a point where he was allowed to be discharged on condition that he came to live with us until he was fully recovered. The next morning the hospital rang to say that he had had a further stroke and died. We were two of the few allowed inside at his funeral but there was quite a large crowd outside. I had limited opportunity to speak to any of them.

I still feel every time I drive to Devizes that I should be seeing him. His house and studio are still there, the studio left just as it was the day he had his stroke, an unfinished painting on his easel.

John's work went through many phases, latterly becoming increasingly dark - a hunched figure walking off into a gloom, but his demeanour did not change during this phase. I suppose he had some premonition, but it was unexpressed. I still miss him a lot and regret that due to Covid there has been no fitting memorial.


