Announcing - **Young Edington Singers** - a new children's choir based at Edington Priory Church and meeting **every Thursday from 6-7pm, starting on 17th September.**

This is an opportunity for children to learn music, to make friends and to have fun singing together. Not only will the children learn musical skills, but they will also learn to work together as a team and gain confidence in public performance.

I know how much enjoyment singing in choirs can bring. I joined a local children's choir when I was 7, and then joined a church choir when I was 8. These were the starting-points for a life-long love of singing, which has seen me participate in over 30 recordings, travel to Europe, America and even China on singing tours and perform in many of the most famous concert-halls in the world.

Choirs are not just about singing, they also bring a social life. Many of the friends I have today I met through singing. Three weeks ago, I was watching cricket with a friend who used to sing with me in a 6-man group. This week I have been invited to a reunion lunch for a central London choir I sang with through the 1980s. Tonight I will be singing and socialising with members of the Edington Priory Church Choir. The bond between singers in a choir is strong and lasting.

What is so enjoyable about singing in a group? Is it the sense of personal responsibility and contribution? Is it the feeling that each individual is valued and important? Is it the sense of working as a team to achieve a common purpose? Is it the striving after improvement and towards perfection? Is it the thrill of performing? It's all of these things and more.

Why not give your child or grand-child the opportunity to be part of something which could bring them life-long enjoyment? What's more - it's all free.

Speed Indicator Device (SID) data

Speed Indicator Device (SID) data for July 2026 is now available to view [here](#). Our 2 devices were positioned one at the eastern end of the B3098 and one on Lower Road. Maximum speed recorded at the eastern end of the B3098 was **60.1mph** (30mph limit). Maximum speed recorded at Lower Road was **55.7mph** (20mph limit).

Full-Fibre Broadband is coming!

Wessex Internet briefed the Parish Council on 10th August about their plans to bring full-fibre broadband to the village in Spring 2027 as part of the Government's Project Gigabit that is funding rural ultrafast connectivity. Installation costs are covered by Government funding, with users only having to pay a connection fee and the subsequent broadband package charge. Look out for [Wessex Internet](#) coming to the village to give a briefing because if you attend this meeting and register your interest then the connection fee is waived. Broadband packages will vary in cost as shown in the material below.

Parish Council News

The Parish Council met on 10th August to discuss routine parish business and review our governance documents in relation to their correctness, accuracy and relevance to the work of a local council. Casual Vacancy

Neighbourhood Plan

The draft Neighbourhood Plan is still open for comments prior to a final redrafting and submission to Wiltshire Council for formal consultation. The revised plan can be found on the website [here](#), as can a form for any comments you want to submit [here](#). Please do take the opportunity to have your say about the plan and future development in the village.

Playfield

Wiltshire Council have approved the playfield land swap planning application by The Three Daggers and we expect work to commence towards the end of August. The playfield will be out of action whilst equipment is moved and associated works are completed. We hope to instal new equipment to replace previously broken equipment at the same time.

Highway Matters / Footpaths / LHFIF

Crossroads Farm Junction - the Parish Council have reiterated their view to Wiltshire Council that the plan to improve junction visibility by relocating one of the hedges will not be sufficient and that we still think that the GIVE WAY signs on the joining roads to the main Edington-West Ashton road should be replaced by STOP signs. Wiltshire Council have declined to change their mind and so we will have to see whether their plan makes any material difference to junction safety once enacted before we try again in future.

B3098 Safety - We are in the process of drafting a note to Wiltshire Council outlining the views of the village about B3098 safety. This B3098 strategy document will be reviewed by the Parish Council at the September meeting before then being presented to Wiltshire Council for their consideration. The outcome of the July 2026 B3098 survey can be found on the village website at <https://edingtonwiltsparishcouncil.gov.uk/wp-content/uploads/2026/08/B3098-Traffic-Survey-Questionnaire-Analysis-final.pdf>, and the strategy document will also be posted on the website once finalised.

Playfield Works

The Three Daggers pub has been granted planning permission to build their new car park and the associated works. They hope to start erecting tree guards in the field commencing Monday 14th September 2026. The playfield and permissive path to the north will then close on Friday 18th September 2026 so that machinery can be brought on site over the weekend ready to begin the works in earnest on 21st September 2026.

Duration of the works and the length of closure of the playfield and permissive path are at present unknown, and will no doubt depend on weather and other construction factors. It is expected to be a few weeks at least before the playfield equipment has been fully relocated, recommissioned and the facility can reopen. We will keep you updated as and when more information becomes available.

People's Emergency Briefing screening - West Lavington

Thursday 17th September at 6.30pm, All Saint's Church

This is a film about the climate and nature crisis featuring Chris Packham, Deborah Meaden, and others.

Brothers Simon and Nick Oldridge, who are climate funders and communicators with a background in business, started this initiative by inviting 12,000 politicians and leaders from business to a briefing in Westminster. From that briefing came the impetus to hold these smaller briefings to inform the general public of the current situation and to press for a national televised emergency briefing.



Their aims are to:

- o enable informed discussion on the crisis
- o enable society to respond to the climate and nature crisis at the speed required
- o work together towards solutions
- o reach a societal tipping point towards genuine emergency action and a better future

You can only see this film at in-person screenings - not online. After the screening there is a facilitated discussion to help everyone air their views on what they have seen and what they would like to see happen next.

This briefing at All Saints' church is open to all. It comes from a scientific background, not from a faith background.

This film has hard facts but points towards hopeful solutions. There is no faith presentation in this screening.

Obituary - Richard Dudley Spicer FRCS



A former Devizes GP who later became a leading paediatric surgeon died recently at his home in Edington.

In the 10 short years he lived in Edington, Richard Spicer very quickly became a key part of our community - he was the epitome of what it means to belong to a village community, he took part in everything he possibly could - and whatever he did, he did it with warmth, endless enthusiasm and an underlying sense of fun.

Richard made friends easily - and was as easy to make friends with. He moved effortlessly across the age groups and political and social boundaries of our village community. His easy smile and gentle - often self-deprecating - manner brought him friends from all walks of life,

He was always happy to share the benefit of his extensive knowledge and enthusiasm, often helping people understand complex medical reports, or responding to health-related questions - but he was equally happy to be part of the pub quiz team, dancing youngsters to a standstill at the May Ball or adding intellectual depth to many, meaningless, Friday-night pub conversations.

Richard was educated at Epsom College, Surrey and later at Guy's Hospital Medical School. He initially became a GP in Devizes but, as his former colleague and long-time friend, Prof. Andy Wolf, explained, his interest lay in surgery and he retrained ultimately as a paediatric surgeon in the UK and South Africa.

Once trained he went to Oman to set up a paediatric surgical service there before taking up a consultant post in Leeds. However, a few years later, drawn by an emerging world class team of paediatric oncologists, pathologists and pioneering clinicians, Richard moved to Bristol to further enhance the critical mass needed to deliver optimum outcomes in the treatment of childhood cancers.

He continued to work as a paediatric surgeon specialising in management of childhood cancer and expanding the horizons of the service through research and development until his retirement.

He was Consultant Paediatric Surgeon, Bristol Royal hospital for Children between 1992-2008; Senior Clinical Lecturer, University of Bristol; an Associate Director of Children's Services, Bristol between 1994-2006; a College Assessor and Examiner; a member of Children's Cancer and Leukaemia Group (CCLG) and founder of its surgical section; a founding member of the International Society of Paediatric Surgical Oncology (IPSO) and President of IPSO 2006-2008 and a member of the British Association of Paediatric Surgeons (BAPS) and Executive of BAPS 1994-1997.

A Fellow of Royal Society of Medicine, Richard was also published in seven books covering neonatal surgery and paediatric oncology and was author of more than 80 papers on varied topics but principally Paediatric Oncology and research papers on gastrointestinal issues.

In addition to his distinguished medical career, Richard had an insatiable thirst for knowledge and a passion for the philosophy of the human condition plus a seemingly unquenchable desire to understand the world in which we live. As a young man Richard had an interest in language and would have, by choice, entered the Diplomatic Service. However, his father, a senior Army medic, decreed that medicine was to be his destiny.

He never lost his love of the written word, so much so that when he retired from medicine he enrolled and graduated in a degree in creative writing and went on to publish both factual and philosophical works.

He loved Edington, the hills around us, the village and its people and would frequently be seen walking his brown cocker spaniel, Digby, in the hills above the village. He loved cricket, sailing, classical singing, poetry, art and music and real ale - he also had a fascination with limericks which he would launch into at any given opportunity.

He was a huge intellect and widely respected throughout the medical community but he was as at home discussing literature, politics and philosophy as he was quoting nonsense poetry and taking part in the, usually, meaningless discussions in the village pub. Above all, he loved taking part, engaging enthusiastically with the people and events going on around him.

His funeral took place at West Wilts Crematorium on 28th July and was attended by well over 200 people as well as being live-streamed to others who were unable to attend.

Richard Spicer was a much-loved man, he made us laugh, cheered us up, helped us understand - he was the knowledgeable medic, the man in the choir, the joke teller in the pub, the cricket expert, the limerick writer. He will be greatly missed. Richard leaves a wife, Jane, six children and six grandchildren.

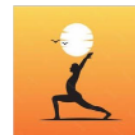

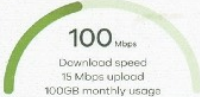
